# What is Teen Interception?

- -A Teen drug <u>EDUCATIONAL</u> program provided by the Forsyth County Sheriff's Office-Free
- -It is **NOT** a scared straight program
- -A program focused on saving Teen lives and redirecting them to make better choices in order to live successful lives

Parent or Legal Guardian MUST attend ALL classes

### Who can attend?

Teens ages 13-17

Volunteered Teens and Mandated Teens can attend but will usually attend separate classes

### When will classes be held?

Classes will be once a week for two hours 6:30 PM to 8:30 PM for approximately 7 weeks Saturday trip to Atlanta will be held 11:00-4:00

# Where will classes take place?

The FCSO Training Center

There will also be some off site classes/trips

### INTRODUCTION

Our first meeting will include an introduction to the program. There are three places that Teens can end up if they decide to continue on a destructive path involving drugs/bad decisions.

- 1-Jail
- 2-Homeless in the streets
- 3-Dead
